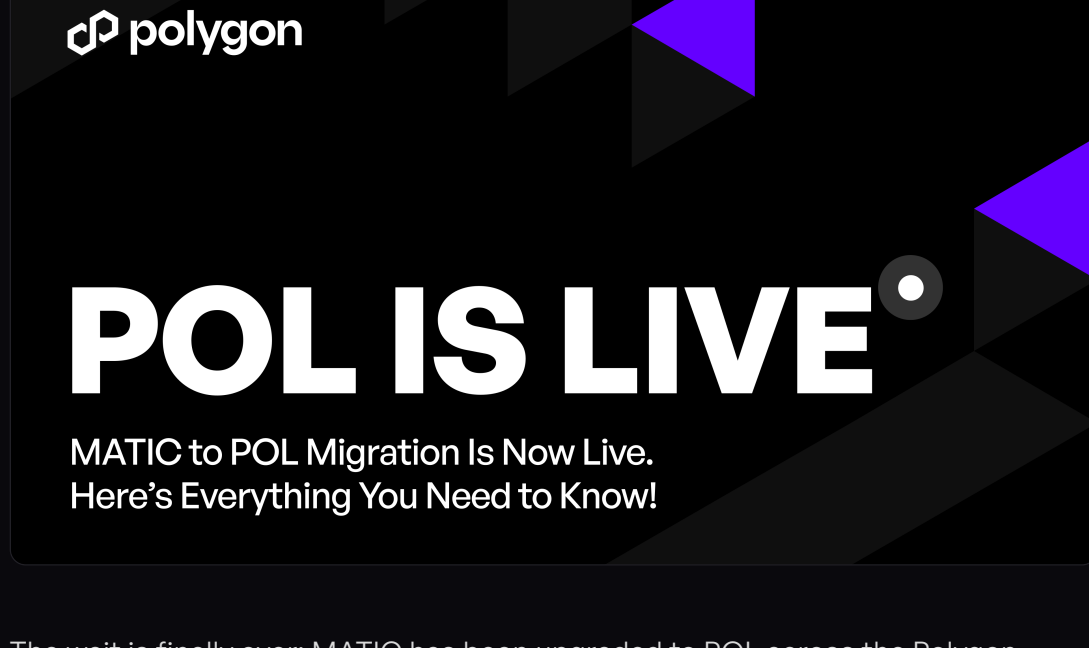


MATIC to POL Migration Is Now Live. Everything You Need to Know.

After a year of community-led discussions and consensus, MATIC has been upgraded to POL as the network token for Polygon.

The wait is finally over: MATIC has been upgraded to POL across the Polygon network! That means every transaction that takes place on Polygon PoS, starting today, uses POL as the native gas token.

This community-driven upgrade comes at a crucial moment when every aspect of Polygon is changing: Polygon is emerging as an aggregated blockchain network via the AggLayer, unifying liquidity and state across a web of chains.

Get [Agg-pilled](#) and understand the importance of a Pre-PIP discussion that, if it reaches community consensus, would see Polygon PoS connect to the AggLayer as part of its evolution into a ZK chain—and thereby bring POL into a broader aggregated network.

The POL migration has not only upgraded the native token for the Polygon PoS network, but in future phases, this upgrade will expand the utility of Polygon's native token to reflect and power the vision of Polygon as an ever-growing network of aggregated blockchains.

At its core, POL is a *hyperproductive* token, a utility token that, subject to community consensus in the future, will have extended roles to play across a number of different dimensions that go far beyond securing a single network. It's an exciting, future-proof evolution of what utility tokens look and feel like, with the possibility for expanded capabilities.

In the first phase of the POL migration, per community consensus, POL will succeed MATIC as the native gas and staking token for Polygon PoS. Subsequent phases, as dictated by community consensus, will see POL play an important role in the AggLayer and networks and services connected to it. Here are the details of what the upgrade to POL means, right now:

- **Backwards compatibility.** This ensures that existing applications and users experience a seamless transition without disruption, facilitating a smoother upgrade process, and preserving the stability of the Polygon network. Makes it easy for validators, delegates, apps, and users to transition smoothly from MATIC to POL.
- **Native gas and staking token for Polygon PoS.** POL now secures the Polygon PoS network—and every transaction on the network is fueled by POL.
- **Future utility for an aggregated network subject to community consensus.** With a staking hub planned for 2025, in the long term, the current community consensus would see POL support broader roles in an aggregated network.
- **Tokenomic Changes.** The initial POL to MATIC upgrade ratio is 1:1, with an important tokenomics change, subject to ongoing community consensus, [that has a 2% emission over a decade to support](#) network security and community development. Half goes to the Polygon PoS staking contract for validator rewards to secure the network, and the other half to a [community treasury](#), supporting builders through a grant program overseen by an [independent board](#) accountable to the community. This emission model will continue for as long as needed, with the community holding the power to adjust or discontinue based on evolving needs.

As the community builds towards the [exciting vision of an aggregated Web3](#), the network has a native token that will help secure it and support the growth of this vision.

In the interim, as Polygon continues to evolve into a multi-pronged, aggregated network, POL will be a crucial part of the massively used Polygon PoS network: It will be used as the native gas and staking token on Polygon PoS—and therefore fundamental to Polygon network security.

So, what immediate actions do you need to take?

- **For holders of MATIC on Polygon PoS**, no action will be required. POL will be upgraded automatically to become the native gas and staking token on Polygon PoS without having to lift a finger.
 - That said, users will need to update the native token symbol in their wallet's network settings. If the token symbol isn't updated, the wallet may continue to display "MATIC" as the token name instead of "POL."

What it means

TL;DR The technical upgrade from MATIC to POL marks a critical juncture for the Polygon network, enhancing utility and aligning with the vision as an aggregated network of blockchains.

What's Happening 1:1 technical upgrade of MATIC to POL.

Why POL will serve as a hyperproductive token: the native gas and staking token on Polygon PoS, as well as supporting the network's future expansion and security as an aggregated network.

All Systems Go The upgrade is anticipated to be seamless. The testnet upgrade was successfully executed on July 17th. Mainnet migration will happen on Sept 4th, but **there is no deadline** for MATIC holders to upgrade to POL. Users can complete the migration at their convenience.

Details

MATIC holders on Polygon PoS. The native gas token of the Polygon Proof-of-Stake network will be upgraded to POL automatically. However, users may still see the token listed as "MATIC" in their wallets. DO NOT WORRY. After the September 4th upgrade, the native token of Polygon PoS will be POL.

- The reason why wallets may show "MATIC" is due to the RPC. Users can manually change "MATIC" to "POL" in their wallet to reflect the upgrade.
- Note: If RPC settings are not updated, your wallet may still display MATIC instead of POL on Polygon PoS.

MATIC holders on Ethereum, or Centralized Exchanges (CEXes). Some action may be required if a user desires to upgrade MATIC to POL. Some dApps have independently integrated the migration contract, meaning they have provided a UI to perform the migration.

- When holders are ready to upgrade, the Polygon Portal has a UI for the MATIC to POL migration: <https://portal.polygon.technology/pol-upgrade>
- Also, DEX aggregators such as KyberSwap and CoW Swap have integrated the migration contract directly into their dApp.
- More advanced technical users may interact with a migration contract that is already deployed to upgrade MATIC to POL on Ethereum permissionlessly.
- **NOTE:** Incorrectly calling the migration contract can lead to the loss of funds.
- **NOTE:** DO NOT SEND FUNDS DIRECTLY TO THE MIGRATION CONTRACT - this will result in an irreversible loss of funds.

MATIC stakers on Ethereum. Automatic Conversion: All staked MATIC will be upgraded to POL on September 4th, with no additional action required.

- Users that DO NOT want their staked MATIC to upgrade to staked POL will need to unstake their MATIC on Ethereum before September 1st. Reminder that there is a 48-hour withdrawal period so be mindful to leave enough time for a successful withdrawal.
